## Welcome to St Andrew's!

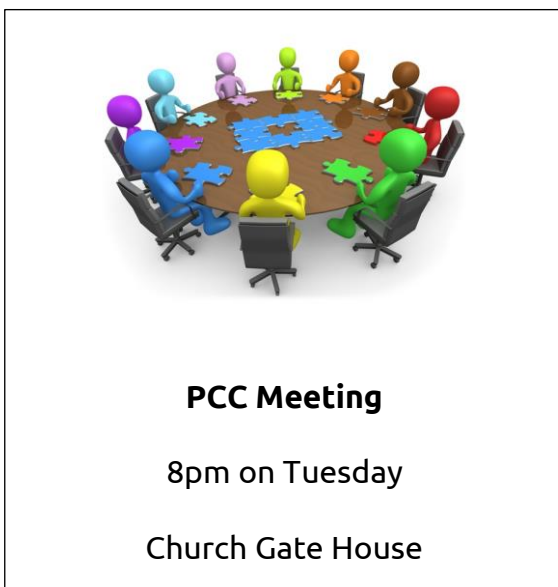
